

University Laboratory School Dress Code Policy

Below are the policies that will govern student dress at school and at school-related functions moving forward. To attend class, students will be required to comply with these policies. Interpretation of these regulations and resolution of any alleged violation is within the sole discretion of the ULS Administration. Additionally, safety, modesty, neatness and cleanliness are required. During the school day, anywhere on LSU campus, the following rules apply:

- 1. All shirts, tops, or sweatshirts must have the LSU Laboratory School logo and must not be modified other than to fit. Sleeveless shirts and crop tops are prohibited. Additional logos or decals may not be added to LSU Laboratory School apparel.
- 2. All LSU Laboratory School branded outerwear (coat, jacket, fleece, sweatshirt, etc.) must be worn over an approved top (see #1). Non-branded outerwear may not be worn in the building at any time.
- 3. Students may wear pants, jeans, joggers, skirts, skorts, or warm-up pants with no rips or holes. Pants, jeans or shorts must be worn at the waist. A belt may be required if a student is not able to keep pants or jeans at the waist. The distance from the bottom of the shorts, skirts, skorts (with shorts underneath); or jumpers should not be greater than four inches from the top of the knee. If warm-up pants are worn, they must bear the LSU Laboratory School logo. Cut-offs are prohibited.
- 4. Leggings, jeggings, or tights may only be worn underneath school-approved bottoms. Tops cannot be longer than shorts, skirts, or skorts.
- 5. On school picture day, students must wear an LSU Laboratory School branded shirt with a collar.
- 6. For field trips, Elementary students may wear their assigned class t-shirt. Middle and High School students must wear an LSU Laboratory School branded shirt with a collar.
- 7. Students may not wear caps, hats, or have the hoods of their sweatshirts on inside the building. This rule does not apply on school-sanctioned specialty dress days. Additionally, religious or medical accommodations will be considered upon request.
- 8. Elementary students are required to wear athletic shoes to school every day. For middle and high school students, shoes with a closed toe and back are required in the building, and athletic shoes are required during physical activities. No crocs or slippers are allowed. For middle and high school students, school-issued physical education uniforms must be worn during physical education classes and may not be worn during any other time of the school day.
- 9. Students may not wear clothing, accessories or other items that advertises, depict, or suggest alcohol, drugs, sex, violence, or denigrate any group of people. Students likewise may not wear clothing, accessories or other items that advertise, depict or suggest any political statement, political advertisement or political candidate information.
